Linda Turri brought up the need for hats and scarves for older children. It seems that they are often neglected in the need for warm winter items.

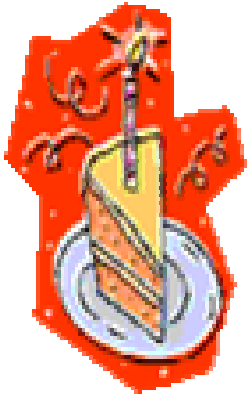
NEW BUSINESS

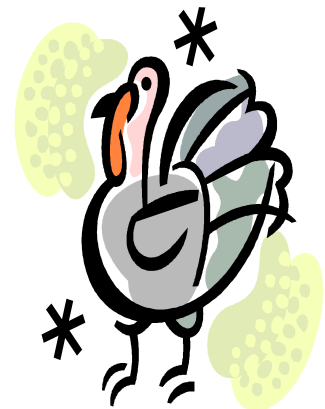
ours out after every outing to our members.

Gingerbread Snackin' Cake

1 cup pumpkin
2 large or 3 small eggs
1 1/2 cups white sugar
1/2 cup vegetable oil
1/2 cup buttermilk
1 3/4 cups flour
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. ginger
1/2 tsp each all spice, cloves and nutmeg
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. baking powder

Preheat oven to 350.
Grease and flour a 9 inch pan. Beat first 5 ingredi-

ents. Sift dry ingredients and add to the rest. Pour into pan and bake for about 40 minutes or until cake tester comes out clean. Enjoy!

A listing of names and titles of managers in your organization is a good way to give your newsletter a personal touch. If your organization is small, you may want to list the names of all employees.

If you have any prices of standard products or services, you can include a listing of those here. You may want to refer your readers to any other forms of communication that you've created for your organization.

You can also use this space to remind readers to mark their calendars for a regular event, such as a breakfast meeting for

vendors every third Tuesday of the month, or a biannual charity auction.

If space is available, this is a good place to insert a clip art image or some other graphic.
